




Kimberly Addison '57 Chocolates Manufacturing








Shamim Kaliisa Chil Ai Lab Health

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


Bosun Tijani Co-Creation Hub

One of the continent's most prolific tech hubs, Co-Creation Hub works at the forefront of accelerating the application of innovation and social capital for a better society.










Project IsizweICT

The charcoal briquettes are a viable low-cost alternative to environmentally damaging fuels such as firewood, kerosene, and wood charcoal and have served the community with clean energy and reduced deforestation.

In partnership with the Global Alliance for Clean Cookstove, they have received approximately \$50,000 in funding to support scaling up their work.

Founded in 2017 by CEO Mostafa Kandil, Ahmed Sabbah and Mahmoud Nouh, Swyl allows users to book fixed rate affordable rides – 80% cheaper than ondemand ride-hailing services - on its network of vans and buses through its app. Swvl intends to invest 300 million EGP in the local market to empower as many microentrepreneurs as possible in Egypt and the region and to become one of the biggest job creators in the country.

Recycle Points is Nigeria's foremost waste recycling and social benefit venture that motivates consumers to recycle by creating value from their everyday waste. Recycle Points developed a point-based incentive model where waste collected from registered post-consumers and in turn reward them with POINTS, with the seed funding from TEF. Chioma was able to drive innovation by procuring two electric cargo tricycles (first of its kind in Africa) for door-to-doorrecyclable material collections.

With a revenue of over \$400,000, Recycle Points has been instrumental in empowering women in lowincome communities





Since the start of its operations, there has been an increase in the number of rural communities with changed attitudes and practices in relation to health and hygiene and sanitation.







UgaBus has reshaped public transport in Uganda by digitising 45% of bus operations hence reducing paper printing and paper waste. They enabled the ticketing model and establishment of data analysis tools to understand public transit and its modelling behaviour through imperial data analysis. In 2018, UgaBus won the African Entrepreneurship Award and was part of Seedstars Kampala in 2019.



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

Njavwa says his company is reducing the cost of delivery significantly, having partnered with a company that provides electric tricycles or tuk-tuks as they are popularly known in Kenya, for this purpose.

Launched in 2011 to combat the stigma on deafness, Megan MacDonald has paved way for dignified work opportunities to Deaf women who are empowered to earn income and celebrate their existing potential through the production of handcrafted iewellery.

FibreReal Estate

Obinna Okwodu is the cofounder of Fibre, a Nigeriabased company helping users find rental accommodation by reducing the entry barriers to renting property in the country.

Through the platform, people can purchase portions of or entire properties and explore renting opportunities. With a 15 percent fee, compared to the standard 20-25 percent fees, Fibre is making real estate more affordable and convenient for Africans across different income brackets. Since launching in June 2016, Fibre has generated over \$1.5 million worth of rental payments to landlords.

EcoTech RDC is a Congolese Start-Up specialised in the development of innovative technologies in the field of ecology. In 2012, they developed a new ecological construction binder called "PLASTON" made from recycled plastic waste which is an alternative to concrete and bitumen. Compared to concrete, this binder offers better strength, elasticity, and thermal insulation.

EcoTech DRC was selected as the winner of the Challenge 1000 Entrepreneurs Afrique-France organized by the French government in collaboration with Digital Africa.
